

If you frequently play Bingo Plus on a shared tablet, such as one used by multiple family members or friends, it's essential to keep your account safe and private. Leaving the app logged in can expose your personal information and gaming details, risking unauthorized access or accidental purchases. In this post, I'll guide you through practical steps to **end your session** properly and manage your device settings to avoid leaving Bingo Plus logged in. I'll also explain the differences in privacy controls between Android and **dgmnews** iOS/iPadOS, help you understand which permissions to grant and when, and why you should be careful about data and support requests.

Why You Should is Staying Logged In on Bingo Plus a Risk?

Many people make the common mistake of simply closing the Bingo Plus app without logging out. This leaves your account open for the next user of the shared tablet, which can:

- Allow unintended access to your game and personal profile.
- Enable unauthorized purchases if payment information is saved.
- Cause privacy issues if contact or support chats are open.
- Trigger notifications that reveal activity to others.

Before we dig into solutions, always remember these key phrases: **end session**, **remove temporary files**, and **do not save passwords**. They will be your best tools against unauthorized access.

1. Verified Download Sources and Checking Domains

First things first, always download Bingo Plus from verified, official app stores to ensure you're using a safe and up-to-date version:

- **Android:** Google Play Store — open *play.google.com*, read the full domain out loud, and check publisher details before installing.
- **iOS/iPadOS:** Apple App Store — open *apps.apple.com*, again, read out the full domain aloud to confirm authenticity.

Avoid downloading Bingo Plus from third-party websites or unofficial sources. Scammers may host fake apps or altered versions designed to steal your data.

2. How to Properly End Your Bingo Plus Session

When you finish playing, take these steps to ensure your session ends cleanly and your data is safe:

1. **Tap the Log Out button inside the Bingo Plus app.** Don't just close the app by swiping it away or turning off the screen.
2. **Clear temporary files.** Depending on your device, you might need to clear the app cache or data from settings (explained further below).
3. **Close the app completely.** On Android, tap the recent apps button and swipe Bingo Plus off the screen. On iOS/iPadOS, open the app switcher and swipe Bingo Plus out.
4. **Turn off "Remember Me" or "Save Password" features.** When logging back in, uncheck any "Keep me logged in" or "Save password" boxes.

5. **Consider using a strong password manager or the device's secure password storage instead of auto-saving within the app.**

Quick Permissions Audit Tip

I keep a personal "permissions audit" note after every major OS update. Check if Bingo Plus has permissions you didn't intend, like access to location or microphone, and adjust accordingly to reduce risk.



3. Android vs iOS/iPadOS Privacy Controls

Your approach depends on the tablet's operating system:

Feature Android iOS / iPadOS App Permissions Go to *Settings > Apps > Bingo Plus > Permissions* — turn off or restrict access such as location, storage, microphone. Go to *Settings > Privacy > Bingo Plus* — adjust allowed permissions, toggle off unnecessary ones. **Clear Cache / Data** *Settings > Apps > Bingo Plus > Storage > Clear Cache/Data* (Data wipe logs you out.) No direct way to clear cache; uninstall & reinstall the app if needed.

Notification Settings *Settings > Apps > Bingo Plus > Notifications* — control previews, badges, sounds. *Settings > Notifications > Bingo Plus* — control previews on lock screen, badges, and sounds. **Password Autofill** Use Google Password Manager or third-party app to save and autofill safely. Use iCloud Keychain for secure password storage and autofill.

4. Managing Notification Settings for Privacy

Notifications can leak your Bingo Plus activity in a shared environment. Here's how to control them:

- **Disable lock screen previews:** Hide message content so others can't read your alerts.
- **Turn off notification badges:** Stop Bingo Plus icons from showing unread alerts.
- **Mute sounds:** Prevent notification sounds that announce incoming messages or support replies.

Exactly where to tap:

- **Android:** Settings > Apps > Bingo Plus > Notifications > toggle off “Show notifications” or customize previews and sounds.
- **iOS/iPadOS:** Settings > Notifications > Bingo Plus > toggle off “Allow Notifications” or set “Show Previews” to “When Unlocked.”

5. Permission Awareness and Timing

Before you grant Bingo Plus any permission, be aware of when the app really needs it:

- **Location:** Required only if you join location-based promos or games.
- **Camera and Microphone:** Usually not needed unless you join video chats or scan QR codes.
- **Storage Access:** Sometimes required to load images or save progress offline.

My advice: grant permissions *only while using the app*. For example, on Android 11+ and iOS 13+, you can allow “Only While Using the App” access instead of permanent.

6. Data Minimization and Safe Support Requests

When contacting Bingo Plus support or using chat features, remember:

- **Never share deposit amounts, promo figures, or pricing in public or unverified chats.** Only share sensitive financial information through official support channels.
- **Verify the support domain carefully.** Official support sites should be part of the verified domain like *bingo-plus.com* or their app support section. Say the full domain out loud to yourself to confirm.
- **Avoid support accounts that ask for one-time codes over chat or email unless it’s a confirmed, secure process.**
- **Request support logs or data removal only through official settings or verified app help.**

Summary: Your Bingo Plus Security Checklist

1. **Download apps only from verified sources.**
2. **Always log out and close the app fully.**
3. **Clear temporary files when possible.**
4. **Disable password saving in the app; use a secure password manager instead.**
5. **Set app permissions wisely—only grant what is needed and only when using the app.**
6. **Control notifications to protect your privacy on shared tablets.**
7. **Be cautious with support requests; avoid sharing sensitive financial details in chats.**
