- **Crash:** A multiplier starts at 1.00 x and rapidly increases. Gamers should cash out before the multiplier "crashes." If they stop working to do so in time, they lose their stake.
- **Live roulette:** Similar to conventional gambling establishment roulette, however typically adjusted with 3 colors (e.g., Red, Black, and Green), where Green uses an enormous payout due to lower chances.
- **Coinflip:** A traditional 1v1 game where 2 gamers wager comparable skin values, and a digital coin flip determines the sole winner.
- **Prize:** Multiple gamers dump skins into a typical pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the person who contributed the most has the highest statistical opportunity of winning the entire swimming pool, though luck can favor

low-tier factors.

Comparison of Common CS: GO Gambling Game Types

To better comprehend how these video games function, the table below breaks down their core mechanics, house edges, and player participation levels.
