Jackpot/ Pot	Numerous players deposit skins into a common pot. A winner is drawn arbitrarily; the greater the worth of the skins deposited, the greater the mathematical chance of winning. Medium (Takes a 5%-- 8% cut of the total pot)
Coinflip	A simple 1v1 game where 2 gamers wager comparable skin values. One is assigned heads, the other tails, and a digital coin determines the winner. Low (Platform takes a small commission, around 3%-- 5%)

How CS2 Skin Deposits and Withdrawals Work
