- **The Ailen Artifact SMG:** Featuring a sleek, futuristic style, this skin is coveted for its clean look and relative deficiency.

- **Huge Grin Metal Facemask:** A challenging, horror-inspired mask that has ended up being a symbol of wealth and high-skill PvP gamers in *Rust*.
- **Glory AK-47:** A majestic gold-and-black attack rifle skin that sticks out as a status sign in any player's hotbar.
