Armor and Protection

In *Rust*, protection is the distinction in between brushing off a gunshot and heading back to the beach. Armor worths on the wiki are computed based on physical defense, **follow this link** projectile protection, and radiation resistance.

Typical Armor Sets

- **Burlap/ Leather Set:** Early game protection; simple to craft, uses very little defense versus firearms, however good against cold and wildlife.
- **Road Sign/ Wolf Headdress Set:** Mid-game meta. Balances movement speed with trustworthy bullet security.
- **Metal Facemask/ Metal Chest Plate:** The gold requirement for late-game PvP. Combined with a hoodie and pants, this package offers maximum security versus raids and strolling squads.

Raiding Tools and Explosives

If building a fortress is half the battle, taking apart somebody else's is the other half. The Rust Items Wiki provides exact explosive computations, helping raiding parties determine the number of resources they require to breach a base's honeycomb walls.

- **Pouch Charges:** Unreliable, volatile, but inexpensive for mid-game raids.
