

Why LED and nothing else

Hardware that never comes down has to handle weather that seasonal strands never see. That rules out most of what people picture when they hear Christmas lights. LEDs generate almost no heat and have nothing fragile inside, which is the whole reason a permanent system is possible. You do not have to follow the technical side to buy well. But it is worth asking what the channel is, how it mounts and how it is wired, because the answer tells you how carefully somebody works. The people who can walk you through it are generally the ones doing it properly.

The half of the system nobody talks about

Each diode lives in a channel, not clipped to a gutter. That channel hides the hardware and aims the output. It gets painted to your trim color before it goes up, so the daytime house does not [permanent lighting installation](#) change.

Individual diodes, not a strip

The lights are individually controllable, which is what makes patterns possible. That is the difference between a single color across the whole house and something that can alternate, chase or fade. Most nights the fancy part goes unused, which is not a criticism. Look at somebody's finished work in the sun, since a dark sky covers a multitude of shortcuts.

Power, control and the parts you do not see

Behind the visible run there is wiring, a transformer and a control unit. How that wiring is routed is one of the better tells of install quality. Ask where the wire goes and where the controller mounts before the install, not after.

What it means that it never comes down

The upside of leaving it up has a matching requirement: it has to be installed well the first time. A system put up carefully does its job quietly for a long time. A rushed one announces itself in daylight, which is exactly what you were paying to avoid. That is why who installs it is not a detail.

Living outside in the Upstate

Nothing about leaving it up is easy on the equipment. Sun and heat do the slow damage. Moisture is the other test. The failure points are almost never the LEDs.

Brightness is adjustable, and most people run it low

The output is not one level. Full brightness is for December, and it is more than an ordinary Tuesday calls for. The everyday level ends up low, and that is the setting doing the actual work.

Seeing it before you commit

Reading about channels and diodes only gets you so far. What actually answers the question is a plan for your own roofline. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?
