The drop rates for each rarity are set by Valve and have remained mainly constant from CS: GO to CS2. Below is a streamlined table of the **official drop percentages** utilized in many CS2 cases:

Note: Individual cases can have small variations, however the general distribution stays within these bounds. The "Covert" tier (Gold) is the most desirable, typically delivering knives, gloves, or exclusive "Case Hardened" patterns.

Observations:

- **Higher-priced cases** (e.g., Broken Fang) tend to include rarer skins, however their market worth can be unpredictable.
- **Lower-priced cases** (e.g., Gamma 2) are popular with beginners due to the fact that the crucial cost is lower, using a higher opportunity of "break-even" when offering typical skins.

5. Methods and Tips for Opening Cases

- **Set a spending plan:** Decide in advance how much you're willing to invest. Deal with case opening as entertainment, not an investment.
