- **In-Game Store (Direct Purchase)**
  - *Cost:* ~ £ 2.50 GBP (differs somewhat by local currency).
  - *Pros:* Always readily available, directly from Valve, completely safe.
  - *Cons:* Non-tradable and non-marketable.
- **Steam Community Market (Older/Specific Keys)**
  - *Cost:* Varies based on supply and need.

  - *Cons:* Often priced greater than £ 2.50 due to collector value.

## Are Case Keys a Good Investment?
